

ITHAKA is a not-for-profit organization that helps the academic community use digital technologies to preserve the scholarly record and to advance research and teaching in sustainable ways.





Our history

- **1995:** started digitizing scholarly journals and making them discoverable in a centralized archive
- **2012:** introduced Books at JSTOR, making academic book chapters discoverable alongside journal articles
- **2019**: enabled institutions to share their Open Community Collections on JSTOR
- **2021**: began integrating millions of artworks and photographs from Artstor on JSTOR





Archival Journals

Complete archival coverage: All journals on JSTOR include the full archival run of every title, back to volume 1, issue 1.

Affordable fees: JSTOR tiers its archival journal collection fees for colleges and universities according to country, institution type, and institution size.

Multidisciplinary Collections

- Arts & Sciences I–XV
- Life Sciences
- Each is comprised of several core disciplines, including Language & Literature, History, Economics, and Political Science.
- 140 titles per collection (on average)
- Titles in 30 languages, from 57 countries
- Content spans more than 60 disciplines



Archive Journals What's included?

- All issues, from volume 1, issue 1, are provided for every journal up to the moving wall, including all previous and related titles.
- Each journal has a "moving wall," defined as a time lag between the most current issue published and the content available on JSTOR. Most archival journals have moving walls of between 3 and 5 years, but publishers may elect walls anywhere from zero to 10 years.
- Tools to enhance user engagement and collaboration

Ever-growing archives

Each year we add hundreds of thousands of articles to the archives as the moving wall for each journal advances, at no additional cost to you.

Communities Public libraries

Public libraries around the globe help patrons gain access to an essential resource that meets their educational, professional, and independent research needs.

Archival Journal Collections packaged in three collections:

Public Library Collections I:

Includes all JSTOR Arts & Sciences and Thematic collections, as well as Business IV Collection.

Public Library Collection II:

Includes all archival Life Sciences content on JSTOR (including the Life Sciences Collection and the Ecology & Botany II Collection).

Public Library Collection III:

Includes all primary source collections on JSTOR: Global Plants, Struggles for Freedom in Southern Africa, African Cultural Heritage Sites and Landscapes, and 19th Century British Pamphlets.

Jewish Studies, Hebrew Journals, and Ireland collections are also available for separate sets of fees.








Artstor Digital Library

- South Asian architecture from scholar Alka Patel.







JSTOR's Open Community Collections are freely available special collections from libraries, museums, and archives around the world.

Content covers a wide variety of subjects through diaries, documents, periodicals, photographs, and more.

The initiative recently surpassed 350 collections and is steadily growing, with more than 100 current contributing partners.





Supporting JSTOR users and library community in 2020

Identifying how JSTOR could help

- Immediate needs
 - Remote access options became urgent as physical locations shut down
 - Librarians and admins required support to address increased access demands
 - Faculty and students needed additional help finding digital resources
 - There was a marked interest in scholarly pandemic-related content

• Economic impact

- The timing of the impact could vary depending on the institution
- The response needed to be fair and equitable and fast

JSTOR's support for libraries during COVID-19

- In partnerships with publishers, we expanded access to unlicensed content
 - Journals and primary sources
 - Collection of 34,000+ ebooks
 - Artstor Digital Library
- Enhanced remote access options for easier off-campus access
 - Introduced Google Social Sign-On
 - Account pairing introduction
 - URLs with proxy

• Additional resources

- Gave free access to 26 Public Health Journals and 6,000+ editorially selected articles about COVID-19
- Increased free online reading program for unaffiliated users from 6 to 100 articles/month
- Created dedicated JSTOR Daily content such as a pandemic syllabus
- Produced ITHAKA S+R reports on the crisis and its impact on higher education

COVID-19 fee relief initiative

- Established a \$4 million initiative to help participating libraries impacted by COVID-19
- 5% fee relief on JSTOR Archives and Artstor annual access fees for one year
- Libraries have three years to use this credit (2021-2023)
- Can be used to license additional resources
- Fee freeze for JSTOR Archives and Artstor for 3 years (through 2023)



Shifting research subject areas

- Health Sciences, Ecology, and Evolutionary Biology usage increases expected
- Double-digit usage increases for Religion, Philosophy, Archaeology, and Music
- May indicate a previous reliance on print resources and less e-resource adoption for some humanities disciplines

Top 10 content usage change in disciplines: 2019 vs. 2020




32% of JSTOR usage in 2020 was through programs offered at no cost to libraries or users.





Strong ebook demand alongside journals

- Offered access to 38,000 ebook titles through June; 34,000 extended through August 2020
- High usage: nearly 8 million ebook item requests
- Ebook usage increased by 90% in 2020 compared to the previous year

More ways to help

- Can still opt-in to expanded JSTOR and Artstor access through June
- Detailed usage reporting to identify high-demand expanded access content
- Freeing up annual expenditures through one-time payment conversions of eligible already licensed collections
- Evidence Based Evaluation (EBE) for unlicensed institutionally selected collections
- Flexible ebook acquisition options
- Rapidly expanding Open Access and free content programs
